If a student has a conflict with the final exam schedule, the student should make arrangements with the appropriate instructor. Instructor will make arrangements for exam to be taken at another time or be made available in the Testing Center. Final examination for minimester will be given on the last regularly scheduled class meeting.

This schedule is for the full 16-week courses, Summer I and Summer II. ALL other courses (Ex: Late Start, PowerPack, Intersession, etc.) will administer final exams on the last scheduled meeting day for the course and will meet for ALL scheduled days through the final week.

Programs of Study

EPCC offers a wide range of classes and academic degree plans in various areas of study meant to transfer to a four-year university or immediate work entry. To see more details on EPCC programs, visit *epcc. edu/Academics/Catalog/programs-of-study.*



Associate of Arts (AA) prepares students to transfer to a Texas public university as a junior with the intention of declaring a major in the liberal or fine arts.



Associate of Science (AS) prepares students to transfer to a Texas public university as a junior with the intention of declaring a major in the field of science, technology, engineering or math.



Associate of Applied Science (AAS) designed to lead the recipient to immediate employment and/or aid in career advancement. This degree typically does not transfer to a four-year university, but EPCC has formal agreements with certain partner universities that may allow transferability, students must check with the receiving institution to verify applicability of credits.



Associate of Arts in Teaching (AAT) prepares students to transfer to a Texas public university as a junior with the intention of pursuing a baccalaureate program that leads to initial Texas teacher certification.



Level 1 Certificate (C1) can be completed by a student in one year or less and consists of between 15 and 42 semester credit hours. Students pursuing this certificate are exempt from TSIA/TSIA2 requirements, but programs may perform local assessment and remediation of students, provided that these activities do not exclude the student from enrollment in the level one certificate program.



Level 2 Certificate (C2) requires that students meet certain eligibility requirements prior to entry into the program and consists of between 30 and 51 semester credit hours. Students enrolling in this certificate are subject to TSIA/TSIA2 requirements.



Enhanced Skills Certificate (ESC/C3) accompanies an AAS degree program and is intended to provide advanced skills which are not part of the AAS degree. It consists of between 6 and 12 semester credit hours and is awarded concurrently with an AAS degree. Few programs offer an ESC, check the degree plans in the catalog or see a Counselor/Academic Advisor for more information.



Advanced Technical Certificate (ATC/C4) Requires a defined associate or baccalaureate degree as a prerequisite. It consists of between 16 and 45 semester credit hours and must be in the same program area as the completed associate or baccalaureate degree. Few programs offer an ATC, check the degree plans in the catalog or see a Counselor/Academic Advisor for more information.



Options for Learning

Whether you're a new student, continuing, or transferring student, EPCC offers alternative options to traditional learning that best-fit students' educational needs and schedule.

Distance Learning

Provides flexibility to fit every student's needs by offering online, hybrid, and synchronous courses. Students should determine if online classes are right for them by taking the SmarterMeasure online learning readiness assessment. Types of courses offered:

- Online Class is taught completely online.
- **Hybrid** Class meets both on campus and online.
- **Synchronous** Class meets online at a specific time and day, as stated on the schedule.

Credit by Examination

Students can take a Proficiency Exam that tests their knowledge of an EPCC specialized course. Before taking any credit by examination test, students should always consult with a counselor/advisor to ensure that the test will support their degree plan. Continuing Education and Workforce/ Ecommerce Development

Workforce and Continuing Education Programs can lead to an external credential (license, certification, or registration) to meet occupational qualifications. There is a competitive two-part ranking process for some health career and nursing programs. First, students must apply for admission to the desired health program and meet the established criteria. Additional Admission Requirements

Submit Official Transcripts

New students must submit their high school, GED, or college transcripts to EPCC. For transcripts to be considered "official," the former school/schools must send the transcripts directly to the Admissions and Registration Department. For further transcripts information, visit *epcc.edu/Admissions/transcripts*.

Bacterial Meningitis Vaccine

Entering students under the age of 22 are required by Texas state law to show evidence of receiving a bacterial meningitis vaccination or booster dose, within five years, or at least 10 days prior to the first day of classes. Students have the option to submit an official *Meningococcal Vaccination exception form. The exemption form and additional vaccine information can be found at

Apply for Financial Aid (FASFA) & Scholarships

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online. FAFSA is required for almost all financial aid programs, and most of the EPCC Financial Aid Offices provide computers and help with completing a FAFSA application. Financial Aid requires a social security number for FAFSA. EPCC's school code is 010387. Assessment Test

First-time college students are required to take a course placement test. The test will determine the students' college readiness and allow for proper course placement in reading, writing, and math. Students who place into developmental courses must be advised by an academic counselor or advisor in order to register for classes. Visit epcc.edu/Services/TestingServices for more information.

New Student Orientation

After admission into El Paso Community College and placement requirements are completed, all students must participate in a New Student Orientation (NSO). Orientation is an opportunity to get off to a good start and become familiar with the many programs and services EPCC offers. Academic Advising

Tuition & Fees

Tuition prices depend on the residency status of the student. For resident students, rates are \$116.00 per credit hour, and for non-resident and international students, rates are \$201.00 per credit hour. Register for Classes

To register for classes visit epcc.edu/Admissions/registration and follow the steps:

- The default PASSWORD uses your date of birth: EPCC-MMDDYY. You must go to https:// apps.epcc.edu to change your password before logging in.
- Click on "Student Registration"
- After changing your password go to: https:// my.epcc.edu to login. Enter your user name (College email) and new password.
- Click on "Register for Classes" to browse 5 and select classes. Pay close attention to the dates, times, & campus locations.
- Navigate to Self-Service Banner and login there, If it asks for a PIN, it will be your Birthday in MMDDYY format.

Student login accounts (Banner/MY.EPCC) are not created until the morning after they are activated in Banner. (If the account is created before 7pm). College Email accounts are not available until the day after a student registers for classes. Again, (If the student registers before 7pm).

Pay for Classes

Remember to pay tuition and fees by the payment deadline to complete your registration and avoid any late fees.

- Emergency Loan: This plan offers a short term, interest-free loan that can be used to assist with tuition or fees. The loan is required to be repaid within the same semester. Students must meet the minimum eligibility criteria to qualify.
- Enter your student ID number.
- Not owe prior semesters debts to the college.
- Minimum 2.0 GPA.
- First-time students are not eligible.

Installment Payment Plan: Students may choose to do an Installment Payment Plan which will allow them to pay one-half of their tuition and fees at the time of registration and the remaining two quarters are due in equal installments by the sixth and eleventh week of classes. Fees

Student ID

The first student ID is free, but each replacement costs \$5.

Parking

Students that park on any EPCC campus must register their vehicle with the Police Department Traffic Office and request a parking decal.

- The individual semester permit fee is \$30 for each semester (fall, spring, or summer) and \$30 for each additional vehicle.
- The academic year permit fee is \$40 (Sept. 1-Aug 31) and \$40 for each additional vehicle.

Add/Drop Fee

\$5 for each add and each drop action; nonrefundable. If you change your schedule of classes after you have registered, you will be charged \$5 for each class you add and \$5 for each class you drop. If you withdraw completely from EPCC, your financial aid award will not cover this cost.

Three-Peat Fee

\$60 per credit hour, refundable. Students repeating certain courses more than two times will be assessed this fee. To see a list of exempt courses visit, epcc.edu/Admissions/Tuition/additional-charges

Distance Learning Support Services Online Fee

Students who register for online and hybrid courses will be charged a \$55 fee.

Emergency Loan Processing Fee

\$10; non-refundable. If you receive this loan, you will be charged a processing fee.

Emergency Loan Late Payment Fee

\$25; non-refundable. If you are late in making a payment on your emergency loan, this fee will be assessed.

First Day Adoption Course Textbook Fee

The course materials adopted by the faculty for your course are electronic course materials, accessible to you starting on the first day of class. These materials come at a guaranteed lowest price compared to the cost of a printed textbook. Opt-out option available before the census date.

General Property Deposit Fee

Students will be charged a \$10 fee the first time they register for-credit courses at the college. The fee is refundable upon request if the student graduates or withdraws within a four-year period.

General Use Fee

All students pay a \$20 per credit hour (refundable) fee based on the number of credit hours or contact hours for which they have registered.

Health Careers Admission Application

There's a \$10 one-time (non-refundable) fee for students who submit their initial admission application to a Health Careers discipline. Financial Aid does not cover the cost.

Individual Instruction Fee

If a student enrolls in a course that typically involves one-on-one instruction time, such as art, drama, music, or speech, they will pay a \$35 (refundable) fee per two-credit course hours (not exceeding \$75). Fees may vary for each course.

Installment Payment Plan Processing Fees

If a student pays their tuition in installments, a onetime \$10 (non-refundable) fee will be added to their total installment loan. On every late installment payment, students will be charged \$25 (nonrefundable) fee.

International Student Admission Application Fee

F-1 students who apply for admission as an international student will be charged a \$25 (non-refundable) fee.

Laboratory Fee

Many science or technical credit courses that require lab time will add a \$20 (refundable) fee.

Late Registration Fee

When a student registers in person at any campus during the late walk-in registration time, they will be charged a \$25 (non-refundable) fee. See *epcc.edu/Admissions/academic-calendar* for registration dates.

Open Education Resource Fee

\$0-\$50; refundable. This fee covers course materials that consist of low-cost or no-cost open-source materials, which are accessible electronically.

Class Changes, Cancellations, and Drops

Before dropping or withdrawing from a course, students should consult with an academic counselor or advisor to understand how it can affect their degree plan or Financial Aid. Contact a counselor or advisor for academic assistance at one of our five locations or, *epcc.edu/Contact/live*.



Adding/Dropping Classes

Students can modify their class schedule by adding and dropping courses within the limited penalty-free time period. After the limited time period, students need to pay a \$5 fee for each add and drop action. Students who register or add/drop their classes after 5:00 p.m. on the last business day before classes begin are not eligible for a 100% tuition refund.

Six Drop Rule

Students have a 6-Drop limit for all undergraduate classes (this policy does not apply to courses dropped prior to census day or to complete withdrawals from the college). Students should consult with their instructor before dropping a class, or if dropping for other personal reasons, they should see a counselor oradvisor.

Withdraw From Courses

Students can visit Web Banner and log in to drop a course or completely withdraw before the first day of class or go to the Admissions Office. For specific dates, please refer to the Academic Calendar. For more information on how to withdraw from courses, visit *epcc.edu/Admissions/withdrawing-from-courses*.

- Fall or Spring semester (16-week courses): Students may withdraw up to the twelfth week.
- Summer I (10-week courses): Students may withdraw up to the sixth week.
- Summer I and II (5 weeks): Students may withdraw up to the second and a half weeks.

Class Cancellations

EPCC reserves the right to change or cancel classes without prior notice. If you are affected by a class cancellation, you will need to go through the add/drop process to replace the course or you will receive a refund by check for the canceled class(es). It is the student's responsibility to check their schedule up until the 1st week of class to make sure theirs courses were not canceled.

General Policies

Academic Suspension

Students on academic suspension must meet with a counselor prior to enrollment.

Campus Carry Law

Texas Senate Bill 11, the "Campus Carry" law, was passed by the Legislature and signed into law by Governor Gregg Abbott on June 13, 2015. This legislation allows a person who holds a License to Carry a concealed handgun on the grounds and in the buildings of higher education institutions. On May 24, 2017, the El Paso Community College Board of Trustees approved the Campus Concealed Carry Task Force Report including designated Gun Free Zones. Effective, August 1, 2017, holders of a concealed license may carry their handgun District-wide to include classrooms not designated a Gun Free Zone. Graduation

EPCC doesn't require applications for graduation. The Registrar will notify eligible candidates for graduation during the fifth week of the semester which they become eligible for graduation. Students not notified, who think they are eligible, may self audit their records to see if they are eligible for graduation during the current semester using *Degree Works*.

Grades

To comply with Texas guidelines, all grades will be posted Online after the end of each term.

High School Articulation

Through articulation agreements with local school districts, the College will award credit for specific occupational/technical courses taken at the high school level after the student enrolls in the corresponding program/major at EPCC. Students should check with a College counselor, advisor or Evaluation Department in Admissions about the procedure for obtaining these credits.

Notice to Students

By registering, you are giving consent to the the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board to provide your current institution with semester credit hour data taken at other institutions. Information will be withheld only by written request to the Registrar's Office.

Undergraduate Credit Hour Limits

Students working toward a bachelor's degree who plan to attend a four-year college or university in Texas should be aware of the 30-hour rule, which went into effect with the Fall 2005 semester. Students can take 30 semester credit hours above the credit-hour requirements of their degree. Credit hours in excess of the limit will not be funded by the state and could result in higher tuition being assessed. This does not include credit hours for remedial, developmental, workforce education, technical courses or hours earned through testing. El Paso Community College will notify students.

Scholastic Standards

Students should carefully review the section of the College Catalog entitled "Scholastic Standards (Academic Standing)." If you have registered prior to the end of the semester and are subsequently placed on academic suspension effective for the semester in which you enrolled, your registration will be voided and any tuition and fees paid will be refunded to the source. Please consult a counselor or advisor for further information.





Definitions & Explanations

Audit Classes

If a student wants to enroll in a class without receiving credit, they must enroll on an "Audit" basis. This requires the approval of a Student Petition by the appropriate Dean prior to the time of registration. Other conditions imposed on the audit of classes are addressed in the section of the online College Catalog entitled "Auditing a Class." Financial Aid will not pay for audited classes. Audited classes are not used in the calculation of full or part-time enrollment status. Any changes to or from audit status must be completed prior to census date. Students cannot receive credit for these classes. (Clinical courses may not be audited due to liability insurance requirements.)

Course Corequisites

Corequisites mean that certain courses or lecture/lab combinations of the same course must be taken together in the same semester. Information on corequisites is provided in the College Catalog and it is your responsibility to ensure that you satisfy the corequisite requirements. Failure to comply may result in being dropped without refund from the course(s) for which the corequisite was identified.

Course Prerequisites

Prerequisites mean that a previous course or condition has to be successfully completed before you are allowed to enroll into a course. This information is provided in the Course Description Section of the Catalog. It is your responsibility to complete the required prerequisites. You will not be allowed to remain enrolled in a course if the prerequisite has not been satisfied and may be dropped without a refund.

Course Overloads

If you want to enroll for an overload (19 or more semester credit hours during a regular semester or 13 or more semester credit hours during the summer session), you must obtain approval from a counselor before you register. To be eligible, you must have the equivalent of a 3.0 (B) Grade Point Average in the last semester you were enrolled as a full-time student. Students should personally return their completed petition forms directly to the Office of Admissions and Registration at any campus." Forms that have not been turned into Admissions and Registration will not be processed.

Student Responsibility

It is your responsibility to satisfy course prerequisites and/ or co-requisites. If you enroll into a course(s) that you do not meet the requirements for, and you do not drop/ withdraw yourself from that course(s) prior to the first day of semester, you may be administratively dropped from that course(s) without refund. It is your responsibility to drop/ withdraw from courses that you will not attend.
